
MONDAY, OCTOBER 30, 2017 Keynote Lecture 7:30 PM AMBASSADOR DAN SHAPIRO

We will read, study and discuss this remarkable work.

Course #4

Title:Fifty years since the Six Day War: War and Peace
and Everything in Between!Instructor:Rabbi Michael Stanger

It has now been fifty years since the Six Day War, the unification of Jerusalem, the annexation of the Golan Heights and the Settlements in the West Bank. In that time, we have seen more war and bloodshed, peace with Egypt and Jordan, and more peace attempts with the Palestinians than can be counted. Some promote an undivided Jerusalem and others a universal one. We have seen the rise of modern terrorism, as well as, the modern Peace Movements and various groups that wish to both support and disparage Israel. How much has happened and how did we get here? And, where might we be headed in the future? We will attempt to retrace and dissect recent history, and predict what could, should and might happen down the road.

Course #5

Title:Religious Pluralism and Israel – Current Challenges and SuccessesInstructor:Rabbi Michael White, Rabbi Alex Kress and Cantor Elena Schwartz

In this class, we will explore the inspiring new creative opportunities for learning, worship and spiritual growth for secular and non-Orthodox Jews in Israel. We will also discuss some of the current challenges to religious pluralism, including the misuse of power by the Chief Rabbinate, the pledge for egalitarian prayer at the Western Wall, problems with divorce law and women's equality, and more. The class will be marked by lively discussion and an opportunity to learn about exciting new spiritual developments in Israel.
